-Student Council News

The student council held a **recent** meeting to discuss the impact of the covid -19 pandemic on their education.

Múinteoir Lisa chaired the meeting and used the following prompts with the council

Which learning situation was better; learning at home or learning in school?

Have you experienced any difficulties with learning or school in general following the covid-19 pandemic.

Has anything changed for the better in school since the covid-19 pandemic.

<u>All members of the student council agreed that the school setting is better for learning. The reasons</u> <u>they gave for this are</u>

- It is easier to focus in school
- It is more social
- A teacher is available to help
- The day is structured/routine
- More opportunities for sports
- More books and resources available

The children talked about spending a lot of the last school year catching up and they felt they had caught up on their learning now.

They discussed the issue that some children being anxious of germs and focusing on cleaning a lot. They mentioned Irish being difficult as they missed out on a lot of learning and the jump from 3rd class (pre-covid) to 5^{th-} 6th class Irish was difficult. They spoke about not having much Irish at home and the impact that had on their learning during the pandemic.

<u>The children also mentioned absenteeism as a difficulty now. They mentioned getting sick more often</u> and missing school more often, especially during the winter months.

On a similar note they mentioned the difficulty of having a substitute or being split due to teacher illness as well. They said that substitute teachers just don't know them or the school well enough and it can be difficult to learn in those circumstances.

Green Schools Committee News

The Green schools committee has been working on attaining a new green flag for Coole National School. The focus of this flag is biodiversity. The children in each class have completed a biodiversity survey and mapped the different habitats on the school grounds. Ms Kelly who is leading the green schools will meet the committee again soon to make further progress.

There is also a lot of activity taking place in our school garden. We are very grateful to our wonderful parents and volunteers who have been beavering away in the school garden to get it ready for planting.

The children are looking forward to helping make it a wonderful space which will enhance their experience in school.

We have also entered the Pride of Place competition for the very first time. This is a competition run by Meath County Council.

Free schoolbooks for all primary school pupils



Information for parents/guardians

From September 2023, schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks for children in recognised primary schools, including special schools, will be provided to every child free by their school. There is no charge to parents/guardians for this, as schools receive funding from Government to cover these costs.

Schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks will be provided by the school.

There is no need for parents to buy o rent these.

There will be no fee for parents for this.

Schools receive funding to buy these items. Schools must prioritise the use of the funding to cover all costs of textbooks, workbooks and copybooks

There may be a requirement for parents to buy some additional items for children to use at school. . The schools must make this clear to parents. All children in the class will have access to the schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks that they need.

The schoolbooks and workbooks will be on loan to the children.

They must be returned at the end of the school year, or if the child leaves the school.

It is important that books are kept in good condition so they can be re-used. Please help make sure your child/children keep the school books safe and takes care of them, so they can be used again by another child.

In Budget 2023, the Government provided over €50 million to eliminate the cost of schoolbooks for children attending primary schools and special schools.
